### REDEMPTION...A Journey through Matthew's Gospel

This week we will continue the **REDEMPTION** series. The morning message will be brought in two parts from two different voices. **Daniel Headrick** will be back in the area from seminary for the weekend and will offer one perspective on the passage and I will bring another. The sermon title for the week is "**Beginnings**," and it comes from **Matthew 4:12-25**. These verses pull together three vignettes that together portray the beginning of Jesus' ministry. It is a story born in prophesy, lived out in the midst of humanity, that demonstrates the healing and redeeming power of God. This is more than



the story of a good man, a great teacher, and/or healer. It is a story of one sent for us. But it is also a story of invitation, where we are invited to come and follow, and to be a part of God's redemptive plan. As we prepare for Christmas, we must celebrate not only the gift of the Christ child, but of a Savior that invites us to be a part of His redeeming work.

### **Concert Series Shortfall**
