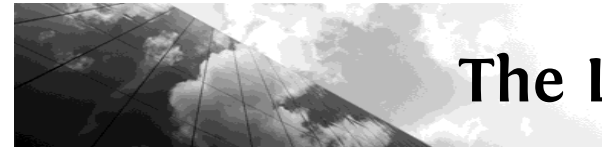

## Clergy Training for Faith Based Initiative
