REDEMPTION...A Journey through Matthew's Gospel

Due to the ice and snow this week, we were unable to send out our weekly Redemption video and reading guide. Keep your eyes peeled for two videos this coming week. Please read Matthew 19-21 to catch up!

Next week's sermon is entitled "Into the Streets" and comes from Matthew 21:1-11. The passage invites us to go into the streets of Jerusalem with Jesus as he enters the city on the back of a colt. This passage provides a powerful context to look at the expectations others heap on Jesus and the powerful imagery that tells us that Jesus was up to something very different than they planned. It is a great opportunity for us to examine our own expectations of God and deal with the reality that God's plans and our plans – that God's ways and our ways are often very different. Instead of getting a Messiah to meet their immediate political needs, Jesus is a Messiah that brings salvation for all of eternity. What do we miss from God when we come loaded with our own expectations rather than seeking his plans?
